

4 MORE DRIVER WINS



NEIMANN BEST AGAIN

Joaquín Niemann earned a record eighth individual title on LIV Golf, winning the LIV Golf Korea championship with a birdie on the first playoff hole in Busan, South Korea.

Niemann, who won five times last season and has three more wins than any player in league history, got it done playing a G440 LST driver, G440 MAX 3W, Blueprint S irons and s259 wedges among his PING technology. See his **What's in the Bag** on page 2.

Niemann is the LIV league's youngest team captain. His Torque GC team includes fellow PING pros Sebastian Muñoz and Carlos Ortiz.



PARK EARNS WIN #20

Min Ji Park added yet another shiny trophy to her collection, polishing her impressive record on the Korea LPGA Tour Sunday with her 20th career victory, coming at the SH Suhyup Bank MBN Women's Open.

She tied the course record in the final round to help

reach the milestone.

Park relied on a G430 LST driver, G440 MAX 4W, G440 hybrids, i240 irons, and a Cadence Ketsch Mid putter.

It was a PING-heavy leaderboard; staffers swept the 1st, 2nd and T3 positions, and six PING pros finished inside the top 10.

iDi Driving Iron

Alvaro Ortiz strode smiling to the sixth green Saturday without his putter in hand because he wouldn't need it. He had just aced the par-3 with his #2 iDi driving iron from 259 yards, a highlight of his week where he earned his first Korn Ferry Tour title at the UNC Health Championship. There was more gallery applause Sunday, when he birdied both 17 and 18 in regulation, then birdied the first playoff hole for his breakthrough win. In addition to the iDi, Ortiz relied on a G430 MAX driver and 3W, Blueprint S irons, and a Scottsdale TR Piper C putter.

READY FOR "THE RIV"

A big field of 17 PING LPGA pros are tuning up for their second major of the year, the U.S. Women's Open at famed Riviera Country Club.

Lauren Coughlin is onsite in Los Angeles, having picked up her third LPGA win in April, as is past champion Allisen Corpuz.

Shuri Sakuma plays her first U.S. Women's Open for her position in the Rolex Rankings on the strength of her fifth career win in Japan this year after a four-win

Hye Jin Choi was T4 at the major last year, and she's been runner-up and third. Hailee Cooper and Linn Grant were also top 10 in 2025 at Erin Hills.
