



U.S. ADAPTIVE OPEN MOORE WINS THIRD TITLE

Kim Moore won her third title in five years at the U.S. Adaptive Open Championship in Rockville, Md., on July 8th, playing 14 PING clubs.

It was a six-stroke victory and back-to-back titles for Moore, who plays with a lower-limb impairment. She relied on a G440 MAX driver, G430 MAX fairways, G440 hybrid, G430 irons, s259 wedges, and a PLD custom putter. Bailey Bish, the 2024 champion, finished T2 playing all PING.

In addition to appearances by several PING-supported athletes, including Karen Veriato, wife of longtime PING player Steve Veriato, PING won the club counts in the driver, all woods, iron, and putter categories.

OPEN LAST SHOT AT MAJOR

PING will be well-represented at the Open Championship at Royal Birkdale, where 22 PING staffers will vie for the Claret Jug (officially the Golf Champion Trophy).

Harris English had a memorable Open last year, finishing runner up; Wyndham Clark was T4, Corey Connors T10.

Clark has been playing the best golf of his career, bringing home two titles, including the U.S. Open, and lighting up the greens with his Scottsdale TEC Ally Blue Onset putter.

The first winner at Royal Birkdale this week is Joe Dean, a DP World Tour pro, who on Monday claimed the final spot in the Open Championship field by winning the Last-Chance Qualifier at the famed host site. It will be his third Open. Dean prevailed in 18 holes of stroke play over 11 others. His par save from a greenside bunker on 18 secured his one-shot victory. It's a continuation of Dean's fine play of late. He was T9 in his most recent outing at the BMW International, and was T3 at the KLM Open.

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Travelers Championship, his eighth career win, and has a third-place finish.

Stewart Cink, the 2009 Open winner who has two major trophies this season on the PGA Tour Champions, makes his 27th appearance at the Open.

Making their Open debuts are: Sam Stevens, who was T7 at the U.S. Open;

Alex Smalley, whose four top 10's include a second and a third; Rasmus Neergaard-Petersen; amateur Mason Howell, who qualified by winning the 2025 U.S. Amateur; and Baard Bjoernevik Skogen from the HotelPlanner Tour who made it through Final Qualifying.

#1: G440 LST, BLUEPRINT S



At the Genesis Scottish Open, G440 LST was the most-played driver model with 22 in bags, and Blueprint S was the #1 iron model; 18 sets were in play.

There were 39 PING drivers total; 30 were G440 models.
