Joaquín Niemann has enjoyed three consecutive multiple-win seasons.

NIEMANN IS THE MAN

Joaquín Niemann continues to pile up victories on the LIV Golf Tour, cementing his status as a man to beat Sunday with his ninth career LIV win, most of any player.

His wire-to-wire three-shot victory at LIV Golf New York was his second win in his last four starts.

Niemann relied on a G440 LST driver, G440 MAX fairway, Blueprint S irons, and s259 wedges among his 14 PING clubs.

"A great feeling to have, especially coming down the stretch on how tough this golf course is," said the 27-year-old, the LIV league's youngest team captain.

JANG BREAKS THROUGH

Eun-Soo Jang is a first-time winner on the Korea LPGA Tour, lifting the trophy at the Jeju Samdasoo Masters, giving PING consecutive victories on the KLPGA Tour. Four staffers finished inside the top 10.

Jang took the lead with a late birdie on 16 Sunday and won by a stroke, calling it

"a moment I've dreamed of."

Her winning technology included a G440 LST driver, G440 MAX 4W, G440 hybrids, Blueprint S irons, and a PLD Custom Ally Blue Onset putter.

Da Yeon Lee also won the previous week with an onset putter, the Scottsdale TEC Ketsch Onset model.

Pictured on the tee at the par-3 third on Thursday, Sahith Theegala got his Wyndham Championship off to an electrifying start, posting six straight opening birdies, tying a PGA Tour record to begin a tournament. His previous best was five straight. Theegala would add two more birdies on the front side to post a seven-under 28. Throughout his regular season, Theegala went on enough birdie runs to earn his return to the FedExCup Playoffs this week with eight more PING pros.

9 POISED FOR PLAYOFFS

Nine staff players are tuning up for the FedExCup Playoffs that kick off Thursday with the FedEx St. Jude Championship at TPC Southwind in Memphis, Tenn.

Wyndham Clark is highest placed among PING pros, sitting fourth in FedExCup points after victories at the U.S. Open and the CJ Cup Byron Nelson, plus two more top 5's.

With career win #8 at The Travelers, Viktor Hovland

returns to the playoffs.

HOWELL DEFENDING AT U.S. AM

Reigning champion Mason Howell returns for his title defense at this week's U.S. Amateur Championship at Merion Golf Club and Philadelphia Country Club.

In 2025 he became the third-youngest winner in the event's history at 18 years, 1 month and 20 days.

Howell will play for his home-state University of Georgia Bulldogs this fall.
